



Am I guaranteed accommodation?

All new entrants to a full-time undergraduate course are guaranteed a room in accommodation for one year*.

However, you must make sure you firmly accept your course place and return your accommodation application form by 1 August of the year of entry to qualify for this guarantee.

What accommodation am I guaranteed?

Catered accommodation at University Park or Jubilee Campus (owned and operated by The University of Nottingham), part-catered accommodation at Sutton Bonington, or self-catered accommodation at Broadgate Park, Raleigh Park or St Peter's Court, operated by third-party organisations who are all recognised providers of student accommodation.

These six sites provide a range of room types to choose from, ranging from single study flats to en suite self-contained studios. In total there are approximately 8,000 rooms available, around 50 per cent of which are self-catered.

All accommodation sites have their own management teams to make sure you're well looked after. There is also a Junior Common Room (JCR) or a Residents' Association (RA) committee at each site, run by students for students, which organises lots of activities for you to get involved with.

Some of the sites also have support services such as wardens and resident tutors.

What other accommodation is available?

There are a number of other third parties who offer similar student accommodation close to our campuses and throughout the Nottingham area. In addition, there are numerous private landlords offering rooms and houses to let – such accommodation is not part of the University guarantee of accommodation.

How much does the accommodation cost?

The fees vary depending on the type of accommodation and type of bedroom you choose. For more information, please refer to the table overleaf, or visit our website for the most up-to-date information: www.nottingham.ac.uk/accommodation

When and how can I apply for accommodation if Nottingham is my insurance choice or I'm a Clearing student?

You can only apply for accommodation when you've made The University of Nottingham your firm choice. You can then apply online for accommodation through our website.

Although you're not automatically guaranteed accommodation, we will still endeavour to help you find somewhere to live in catered or self-catered accommodation depending on vacancies available at the time you apply.

Where can I live after my first year?

You can apply to stay in any of the halls or self-catered flats that were part of the guarantee in your first year, either as an individual or with a group of friends. Alternatively, you can live in other developments or look for housing with private landlords. Our website contains further information and advice: www.nottingham.ac.uk/accommodation

What's available if I have specific requirements?

If you have a disability and require accessible accommodation, you're guaranteed suitable accommodation for the duration of your studies. We have accessible rooms on each campus, which can also be adapted to meet a student's individual requirements.

Students' specific personal requests, such as medical or religious requirements, will be taken into consideration according to priority and availability. If you have a medical condition, you'll need to provide written supporting documentation with your application.

Most of our sites are for mixed-sex occupancy, but we will endeavour to provide single-sex accommodation on request.

How do I apply for accommodation?

Once you have firmly accepted your course place, you can apply for accommodation online through our Accommodation Services website. The application form is usually available from 1 March until the start of the academic year. Hard-copy application forms are available on request if you don't have access to the internet.

We allocate accommodation on a first-come, first-served basis, so we advise you to apply early to maximise the chances of getting the particular accommodation you want.

* New entrants to a full-time undergraduate degree course who are classified as 'international' for fee purposes are guaranteed a room in accommodation for three years, subject to submitting a returners' application in line with the stated requirements of individual accommodation providers.

What's included in my fees?

Fees usually include bills (heat, light and water), personal contents insurance, internet access, membership to the Junior Common Room committee and meal deals for catered halls. A discounted flexible lunch system that allows students to eat their lunch in a variety of Nottingham Hospitality food outlets across Jubilee and University Park Campuses is available to all students and is included in the meal deal for University-operated catered halls.

Extra things that you need to pay out for vary depending on the site you choose but can include phone connection and calls, and a TV licence. The discounted flexible lunch card can also be purchased by students who choose self-catered options.

Facilities

In all of our guaranteed accommodation you will enjoy:

- **internet access** – to help with independent study and make staying in touch with family and friends easy
- not having to worry about your belongings – **personal contents insurance**, provided through Endsleigh Insurance, is included in your hall fee
- **Junior Common Room or Residents' Association membership**
- a range of **different room types**
- a **laundrette** (so you don't have to take all your washing home)
- **storage facilities for your bike**, so you don't have to keep your wheels in your wardrobe!
- a **communal cleaning service**
- **security**

Additional facilities in catered halls include:

- **freewire TV** via your laptop – don't forget to buy a TV licence
- a **telephone connection** which operates on a pay-as-you-go phone card system
- a **fridge** in each room for your drinks and snacks
- a **secure lock** on your door
- a **dining room** where you can eat breakfast and dinner during the week, and brunch and dinner at the weekends
- **flexible weekday lunches**, which can be taken at any of the retail outlets on University Park or Jubilee Campus
- a **pantry** with a sink, hot-water boiler and microwave in case you get hungry between meals
- a **bar** – which means you don't have to leave your hall to have a drink with friends
- **rooms cleaned every fortnight**, just in case your room isn't quite pristine...

- help and guidance from a **warden and live-in tutors**, should you need it
- term-time contracts, so **you don't have to pay for your room during the holidays**

Additional facilities in self-catered accommodation

Self-catering gives you the freedom to cook your own meals, but also provides plenty of opportunities for socialising. Undergraduate contract lengths start from 43 weeks, depending on your location, which includes vacation periods so you don't need to move out of your room over Christmas and Easter if you don't want to.

Broadgate Park is located in Beeston and situated close to the West Entrance of University Park. Additional facilities include: a new cafe, games room, bar, parking, mini supermarket, and an on-site management team along with a warden and tutors.

Raleigh Park is situated in the popular student area of Lenton, close to the city centre and Jubilee Campus, but also just 20 minutes from University Park and the Queen's Medical Centre. Additional facilities include: parking, bar, common room and an on-site management team.

St Peter's Court is ideal for easy access to both Jubilee Campus and the city centre, offering a free bus service to the city and both University Park and Jubilee. There are plenty of local amenities on your doorstep, from pubs and cafes to shops and takeaways. Additional facilities include: a gym, common room, parking and an on-site management team.

Part-catered accommodation at Sutton Bonington Campus

Located half-way between Nottingham and Loughborough, this 40-acre campus offers a sports centre, restaurant, cafe, bar and several shops. Choose from refurbished original houses or newly built en suite accommodation. There are regular free shuttle bus services to University Park and Jubilee Campus.
